Bonafides

Funding

- Reigns can be expensive (example: 2018 summer principality reign \$6K)
- Reimbursement is limited
- Fundraising is expected to replace principality travel fund monies

- Useful vs Decorative Staff Conversation
- Positions
 - Head of Retinue
 - Principle Attendant (Ladies and Lords in waiting)
 - Guard Captain
 - Court Coordinator
 - Scribe
 - Royal Liaison
 - Fundraiser*



Infrastructure (continued)

- More staff
 - Grail bearer (Summits specific)
 - Herald
 - Clothier
 - Campmaster/cook
 - Largesse Coordinator
 - Reign Chamberlain*
 - Quartermaster (hauler of trailer)*
 - Child and/or pet wrangler*
